

"May is Better Hearing & Speech Month - 2010"

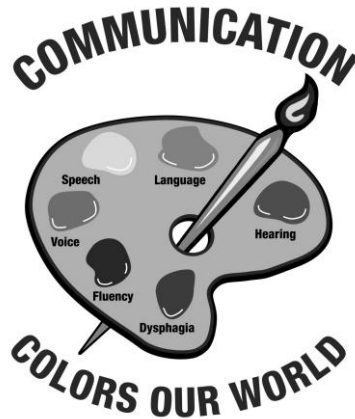
Annual Poster Contest

OFFICIAL RULES

1. The contest is open to **ALL** school-age children (kindergarten through 12th grade) in ANY setting (i.e. public/private schools, hospitals, agencies, centers).
2. Posters will be judged in the categories of grades K-2, 3-5, 6-8, and 9-12 or equivalent.
3. Each school must choose their 5 best posters per category. They will be judged by the LISHA Executive Board and LISHA members, who attend the LISHA Executive Board meeting in April, 2010. Cash prizes will be awarded to three winners in each of the four categories. A Certificate of Participation will be given for each entry. It is each teacher's responsibility to inform the poster drop off person and/or Susan Broderick or Terri Lucks of the total number of Certificates of Participation needed.
4. The winning posters will be displayed and winners will receive their awards at a special awards ceremony to be held on May 26, 2010. This ceremony will be held at the East Meadow School District at the Campo Salisbury Center, 718 The Plains Road, in Westbury.
5. The poster must be:
 - a. an ORIGINAL ART WORK
 - b. Drawings with or without words
 - c. Augmentative and Alternative Communication(AAC) generated artwork accepted
 - d. On standard oak tag, size 22" x 28".
6. **The following information is to be included on the reverse side of the poster:**
Student's name, address, phone #, email, age, category (grade), complete name of setting, audiologist/speech-language clinician's name, email, phone#, and drop-off site.
If the required information is not included on the reverse side of the poster, the poster will not be judged. After submission, all posters become the sole property of LISHA and cannot be returned.
7. Finished posters are to be received by LISHA **no later than April 9th 2010.**
