(Parents Encouraging Eating and Swallowing) support group for parents of children with feeding disorders. She was featured in Advance magazine for her expertise in GI issues in pediatric feeding and has nutrition information to be published in the 2009 Desk Reference for Speech Pathologists.

Overview

This course provides an overview of common GI and nutritional diagnoses, their impact on feeding and feeding therapy recommendations and techniques. Emphasis will be placed on tube feedings, pediatric formula choices, and treatment options for infants and young children with GI issues. Participants will gain a general understanding of common pediatric feeding disorders and their related diagnoses, as well as treatment strategies to utilize for children with feeding difficulties.

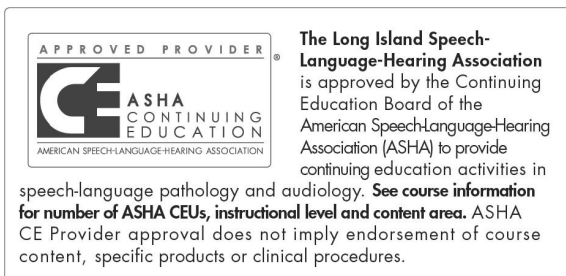
Learning Objectives

Directions

Coming from East: SOUTHERN STATE PKWY WEST Merge onto WANTAGH PKWY N via exit number 27N toward WESTBURY. Take the exit W2 W toward OLD COUNTRY RD. Turn SLIGHT RIGHT onto DUFFY AVE, Turn RIGHT onto OLD COUNTRY RD. Turn LEFT onto CARMAN AVE. Continue to follow CARMAN AVE. Turn RIGHT onto STEWART AVE. Turn SLIGHT RIGHT onto THE PLAIN RD. End at 718 THE PLAIN RD. Proceed to large parking area at center.

Turn SLIGHT RIGHT onto POST AVE. Turn LEFT onto OLD COUNTRY RD. Turn RIGHT onto WESTBURY RD. WESTBURY RD becomes VALENTINES RD. Turn SHARP LEFT to stay on VALENTINES RD. VALENTINES RD becomes THE PLAIN RD. End at 718 THE PLAIN RD. Proceed to large parking area at center.
